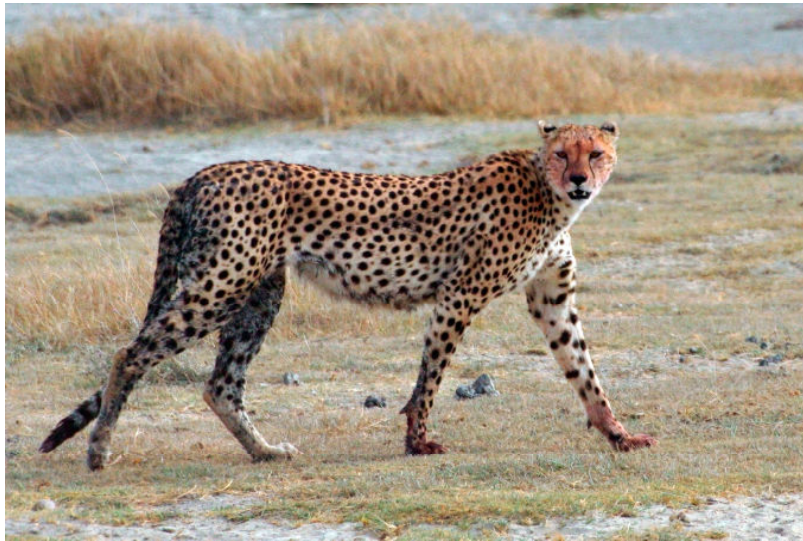

FOUR CHEETAHS ARRIVE AT KARNATAKA BIOLOGICAL PARK



- Four cheetahs brought from South Africa have been placed under care at the Bannerghatta Biological Park in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- In 2022, the Central Government launched the Cheetah Reintroduction Project to bring back cheetahs, which had gone extinct in our country 70 years ago.
- Cheetahs brought from South Africa and the African nation of Namibia are currently being maintained at the Kuno National Park and Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh.
- Due to changes in climate and weather conditions, these cheetahs that arrived in Bengaluru from South Africa must be monitored closely to ensure they do not develop health issues.
- These animals must be kept in quarantine for 30 days and provided with a prescribed diet.
